On The River Classes and Clinic 2017

On-The Water Clinic:

The on the river clinic is held on the Lower Owens River near Bishop. Many of the items discussed in the classroom setting are covered in the field. In addition, the on the river clinic includes reading the stream, insects including in-stream entomology, casting, mending, setting depth of flies using indicators, and numerous demonstrations. The second day on the river includes fishing one-on-one with one of the more experienced club members.

Based on prior year's success we are conducting the On The River Classes and Clinic program again in 2017 on the dates listed above.

During the past two years the FFCOC's On The River Classes and Clinic training programs have been great successes providing almost 40 club members introductory classroom and on the river training. Joe Libeu, a FFF Certified Master Instructor, professional Caster quide. developer and instructor for Advanced Nymphing Clinics on the Owens river and member of our Club has provided six hours of classroom training and a two days of on the river training to these participants. Numerous experienced Club members have assisted Joe providing hands training during the on the river clinics.

The program includes everything needed to plan and prepare for a successful fly fishing trip. Classroom training subjects included equipment, insects including their life cycles and how flies imitate them, how trout behave, clues as to what fish eat, stream care and etiquette, reading the water, nymph rigging and much more.



The training is focused on helping new FFCOC members learn the basics of fly fishing and will be in follow up to our annual *Casting Clinic* scheduled for Saturday September 9th. Participation in the On The River Classes and Clinic is limited. New Club members that sign up as a result of the September *Casting Clinic* will be given preference. Prior participants are welcome to participate again if space allows.

Trip Reports

Big Horn Fishing Trip Report by Alan Ross

We just got back from 3 days of wonderful fishing at the Montana Fly Fishers & Leaning Tree Lodge in Fort Smith, Montana. Mark Spowart and I had a great time nymphing with a double rig (sow bugs and trico emergers) and throwing streamers during three days of dramatically different weather conditions. The first day was hot and got into the mid 90's, the second day was very windy, cloudy and barely got to 70, and the last day was clear and in the lower 80's. As a result of the weather variability and the changing water flow rates, we waded most of the time with nymphs and used streamers between each wading section and before our final takeout point. Each of us caught numerous fish and even landed several browns and rainbows in the 18-20 inch range. Streamer fishing was challenging, fun and successful since neither of us has had much experience using this technique. Lodging accommodations were excellent and the food and hospitality were amazing. We highly recommend Montana Fly Fishers if you decide to try this river in the future. On our way back to Denver we also visited the Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument (about 45 miles from Fort Smith) and learned some very interesting facts about the Indian and soldier perspectives about that famous battle. This is well worth an extra half-day if you can afford the time. Please feel free to call me or Mark if you have any questions about the trip.

Fly Tying

Flies That Keep On Giving

I'm an avid follower of Davie McPhail's; when you can understand what he is saying he is one of the best tiers I have ever witnessed. I have had many idol tiers like Bill Blackstone, Bob Moyer, Dave Boyer and one of my past students Cheryl Moore, there are many more. I still dub with wet fingers with saliva on them, for you Cheryl. Flies I commonly use and see tied wonderfully get me to the bench and I tie several to keep my boxes full, this is one such fly. The one pictured is a #12 but can be tied from 12-18.



Emerging Caddis Pupa

Hook: Knapek G #12 Czech Nymph Hook

Thread: UTC 70 Black

Rib: Veevus Medium Pearl Tindel

Colored Pen: Permanent Brown

Abdomen: Hare's Ear Plus Dubbin Tan #7

Antennae: Pheasant Tail Fibers
Legs: Dark Deer Hair

Thorax: Semi-Seal Brown Dubbing **Cement:** Super Glue Gel Control

Start your thread at the eye and wrap deep into the bend of the hook while also tying in the rib/ tinsel and leave to the rear for now. Dub the abdomen into a carrot shape getting larger as you move forward and stop at the ³/₄ point forward. Mark the tinsel on the inside before you rib the abdomen making five to six ribs as you move forward and tie off just in front of the thorax. Lay several dear hair fibers on the top and sides and tie in with a few wraps of thread. Tie in two pheasant tail fibers as antennae and let them extend to the rear twice the shank length and leave them split apart while on the top of the fly. Dub the semi-seal dubbing to form the thorax. Make the eard with your thread and coat about ½" of the thread with super glue and whip finish, this make for a quite durable fly. Cut your thread free. The antennae can be coaxed to bend by rubbing you finger nail against them from the side you wish them to bend, be careful they can break. This fly can also be weighted with a tungsten bead before you start tying but all my flies have different places on my rig and I do prefer a few to ride higher in the water Colum. You will note that at some angles the ribs are pearl and at others brown, nice trick Davie.
