This Month's Meeting

'Ghost of the Coast' Sightfishing for Corbina with Glenn Ueda

The Corbina is the West Coast version of a Redfish or Bonefish, and is similar in shape and size. The mouth of the Corbina sits low on its jaw, which enables the fish to feed on the sandy bottom with greater ease. The Corbina is a member of the Croaker family and can be found as far north as Point Conception and south down the Baja Peninsula. Corbina are highly sought after in the surf and at times can be tough to catch on a fly.



Our guest speaker this month is Glenn Ueda. Glenn is an expert on sighting and catching Corbina in the surf. He is the holder of multiple IGFA records, and is an accomplished guide and instructor on surf fishing.

Glenn started surf fishing at a very early age under the watch of his father. At the age of five he was hurling pyramid sinkers for surf fish throughout the beaches of southern California. Many years later he read an article on fly fishing in Sports Afield and soon began his passion for the sport of fly fishing. He learned how to cast from a family friend who would take him to the Long Beach Casting Club. Soon Glenn fished local parks and the west fork of the San Gabriel River for many fresh water species. However, saltwater was in his veins, and as he grew older his passion turned back to the ocean.

Glenn has fished domestic and international destinations that include Brazil, Belize, the Bahamas, Christmas Island, Florida, Louisiana, Hawaii, Montana, Idaho and of course the waters of California. Today Glenn spends over 200 days on the water, and has caught over 108 species of fish. In 2017 he began his guide service 'So Cal Flats Fishing Guide Service', and he enjoys teaching and giving seminars on the art of fly fishing in the surf.

Glenn's program, 'Ghost of the Coast', will include sight fishing for Corbina, basics including seasonal patterns, food sources, tidal cycles, structure recognition, and approach and the use of proper fly fishing equipment.

Please join Glenn Ueda as he takes us into the California surf for 'Ghost of the Coast' sight fishing for Corbina.

Fish Creek Outing - June 1-3, 2018

Fifteen club members including seven new members joined for the annual adventure to Fish Creek Campground in the southern part of Sequoia National Forest the first weekend of June.

After two years of near normal flows, we encountered drought conditions again this year. Fish Creek was barely two feet wide and 8 inches deep at the campground meadow. This was a dramatic decrease in flow from the previous weekend where Curt Clark reported significant flowing water. This is more proof of the very light snow pack this last winter in the Southern Sierra Mountains.

Weather was excellent. The usual 100 plus degrees in Ridgecrest, but a warm 80 in Kennedy Meadows. At night, temperatures went down to the low 30's. It was absolutely clear skies, so you could see countless stars.

Participants included new members Laurie and Nelson Arroyo, Cullen Arroyo, Roger Beers, Matt Werner, Mostafa Sobian and Andy Sprowl. The usual regulars were in attendance including Ronny Van Horn, Ron Raygoza, Dawn and Vern Martin, Charlie Beers, Kenny Holmes, Tim Griffin and Brian Mayer.

On arrival on Friday afternoon, Ronny and Ron reported easily finding fish which encouraged us all. However, Ronny reported that a tree had fallen and blocked the road to "Rattlesnake Meadow". He described it as being 12 to 18 inches in diameter.

Saturday morning, the crew enjoyed the traditional pancake and pork product breakfast. Yummy. After breakfast and packing lunches, the group split up into three parties. One group went to Troy Meadow to fish the open meadow. They spent the morning fishing and then headed to the South Fork Kern River for the afternoon. A second group headed to "Rattlesnake Meadow" above the Blackrock Ranger station. We hiked down the road to the meadow from the Menache jeep trail to scout out the downed tree. We were surprised to find the tree was nearly 3 feet in diameter (Ronny sure knows how to under state !). The Forest Service will be busy for some time trying to remove it. At this point, we decided to return to the Troy Meadow area to fish. The third group, Charlie, Kenny, Tim and Roger fished downstream from the campground.

Even with the low water in Fish Creek, many of the usually 4 to 6 inch Golden Trout were found. Amongst the whole group, nearly 70 fish were caught on Saturday !

Saturday evening, we all gathered to share a campfire, pot luck dinner and trade stories. Dawn made her famous bean dip. Vern and Charlie provided Bratwursts galore. Laurie provided an excellent Chick with Rice dish.

On Sunday, after packing up and tidying up the camp sites, several members went to the South Fork Kern River at the highway bridge. There was plenty of water at the bridge which

encouraged a large group of PCT hikers to go for a swim (or bath) just upstream from the bridge! A little exploration found plenty of fishable water, but very few fish. Mo Sobiah did manage to surprise himself and hook a couple of fish in the riffle just upstream before the hikers dove in. Downstream, we managed to find 6 fish in a group willing to chase the fly repeatedly but not willing to hook up for us.

All things considered, it was a very pleasant weekend trip and a great get away from the big city stress. I for one am looking forward to next year's outing.

Fly Tying

FLIES THAT KEEP ON GIVING

By John Williams (Uncle Willie)

Lest you think I only fish nymphs and streamers, when the fish are on the surface I relish the chance to see the take and the fight that follows. You have seen a variation of this fly and now another, I can't leave well enough alone.

Willie's Hopper "New Version"



Hook: Firehole #718 Size 10 or similar
Thread: UTC 140 Rusty Brown
Super Glue: Gorilla Glue Impact Tough Formula, Brush or Nozzle Bottle
Head, Thorax, Abdomen: Tan 2mm Craft Foam cut to ¼" width
Wing: Grizzly Hackle ¼" in width paired against foam width
Legs: WAPSI #RRB353 Barred Round Rubber Medium Brown/Gold

Cut the foam to ¹/₄" and round one end with scissors. Place the hook in the vice and start your thread behind the eye and wrap into the bend a short ways and back up to the ¹/₄ point forward on the shank, let the bobbin hang. Smear super glue from the bend forward to 2mm from the eye lightly applied. Center the foam over the shank of the hook even with the bend and fold the foam over the entire shank as you wrap the foam in the first segment, run the thread forward to the next segment area and lay down the foam and repeat forward until you have made all the segments you desire. Remember the more you segments you add the less floatation you have because you need the air trapped in the foam for floatation. When all the segments are done place the wing extending 1/8" beyond the back of the foam and secure with a couple of wraps of thread. The rubber leg material comes in a attached round segments like a ribbon, separate two ribs of the material and tie an overhand knot in one end to form the leg and place one on either side of the body tied in at the same location of the wing. Add a smear of super glue at this tie in area and advance it 1/8" forward as well. Fold the foam back toward the rear to form a bullet head and tie down in the same area you tie in the wing. Trim the legs to your desired length and make a cut to release the foam by diagonally trimming from either side toward the rear. Place a slight smear of super glue on both knots to keep from untying.

This is a wonderful fly to use as a indicator fly with a smaller dry or dropper fly to the rear. Tight Lines Friends, John
